MEMBER CODE OF CONDUCT

Dunheved Golf Club (DGC) membership is a privilege and members are expected to display behaviour in accordance with the standards as outlined in this Code of Conduct.

It has been developed to ensure that members and visitors demonstrate respect for the people, environment, competitions, rules, property and reputation of DGC.

Always observe and follow the dress regulations of the club. This shows respect for the club and the game of golf. Playing and practicing in inappropriate clothing is prohibited.

Members must;

- Always observe and follow the dress regulations for the course and the club;
- Be courteous and not harass or abuse other members, guests, DGC employees and volunteers;
- Refrain from disorderly or disruptive behaviour on the course and in the clubhouse (eg swearing and club throwing);
- Comply with the Rules of Golf, DGC Local Rules, competition requirements;
- Care for and maintain the quality of the course by undertaking repairs (filling divots, fixing pitch marks and raking bunkers);
- Not bring food and drinks for consumption into the clubhouse;
- Not bring alcoholic drinks onto the golf course or into the clubhouse for consumption;
- Handle all DGC property with care and diligence;
- Not tarnish the reputation of DGC or bring into disrepute (eg through word of mouth or social media)

Members are encouraged to report any inappropriate behaviour to the DGC Management for action and follow up.

If a breach occurs and can be proven, DGC will initiate disciplinary action, which may include verbal or written warning, withdrawal of privileges and suspension or termination of membership.

RISK & LIABILITY

All golfers acknowledge they enter the golf course at their own risk. Dunheved Golf Club Ltd (DGC) does not take any responsibility for golfers injured whilst on the course and surrounds, outside of a reasonable duty of care. Parking is at own risk. DGC does not take any responsibility for any theft or damages whilst parked at the premises.

WILDLIFE

Wildlife such as birds, kangaroos, snakes, bees, emus and rabbits roam in and around the golf course and premises. Please do not approach or interfere with the wildlife.

LIGHTNING OR DANGEROUS CONDITIONS WARNING

Any time there is lightning activity there is significant risk of being struck. It is your responsibility to check weather forecasts to ensure your own safety before using the golf course. It is a condition of entry to the golf course that you acknowledge that you do so at your own risk.

SUSPENSION OF PLAY DUE TO LIGHTNING OR DANGEROUS CONDITIONS

DGC may suspend play when lightning or other dangerous conditions threaten players safety. You may also suspend your play if you believe you are in danger at any time – do not wait for DGC to suspend play if you feel unsafe.

SIGNALS;

ONE LONG BLAST (repeated one after 30 seconds)	Discontinue play immediately and proceed straight to a safe area.	
TWO SHORT BLASTS (repeated once after 30 seconds)	Resume Play	

RULES ISSUES WHEN PLAY IS SUSPENDED (Rule 5.7)

- Lifting a ball after play has been discontinued.
 The ball may be left where it is or lifted. Before lifting the ball, the player must mark its position. If the player fails to mark the position of the ball before lifting it they incur a penalty of one stroke.
- 2. Procedure when play is resumed.
 - a. If the player has lifted the ball, they must place the original ball or substituted ball on the spot from which the original ball was lifted.
 - b. If the player has not lifted the ball they may lift, clean, and replace the ball, or substitute a ball, on the spot from which the original ball was lifted. Before lifting the ball, they must mark its position.
 - c. If the players ball or ball marker is moved (including by wind or water) while play is discontinued, a ball or ball marker must be placed on the spot from which the original ball or ball marker was moved. If the spot where the ball is placed is impossible to determine, it must be estimated, and the ball placed on the estimated spot.

CALLING UP ON PAR 3'S

Playing golf involves inherent risks, including risk of being struck by a golf ball. The risk of being struck significantly increases when players "call up" the following group on a par 3 hole. <u>Calling up on a par 3 hole is not encouraged</u>. Any player calling up a following group at DGC does so at the players own risk and will not be covered by insurance.

GOLF CARTS & MOTORISED VEHICLES

- a) No more than two people per vehicle at any time.
- b) Unless otherwise guided by posts, ropes and blue lines please keep vehicles a **minimum of 10m away from all greens**, water hazards and tee boxes.
- c) To assist with the pace of play never park in front of greens.
- d) Players are to obey all vehicle traffic rules and signs and shall give way to course staff and machinery.
- e) If course conditions are wet, vehicles should only travel on the driest and firmest parts of the golf course. In the rough where possible.
- f) Persons under the age of 18 who do not hold a valid driver's licence, are not permitted to operate motorised carts at any time, including sitting in the driver's seat.

MEMBER & VISITOR PRIVATELY OWNED & OPERATED VEHICLES

- g) Permission must be requested and granted by the Board of Directors or management to access DGC with privately owned motorised golf cart or motorised ride on vehicle.
- h) Personal/Private Public Liability Insurance is required to be registered with DGC Office.
- i) Valid Insurance is to be always maintained. Updated or amended Insurance details must be provided to DGC office prior to the expiration of the current policy.
- j) A current insurance sticker/label will be provided by DGC Office and must be always displayed on applicable cart/vehicle.
- k) Privately owned motorised golf carts or motorised ride on vehicles incur a fee/levy payable on each occasion for a competition or social round and must be paid to the Golf Shop prior to the commencement of play on each occasion.
- I) Members who are granted permission to use their own motorised golf cart or ride on motorised vehicle at DGC agree to all the Rules and Conditions surrounding cart usage and course conditions.
- m) Any breach may result in motorised golf cart or ride on motorised vehicle access permission revoked.

DGC LOCAL RULES

To be read in conjunction with the current rules of golf.

OUT OF BOUNDS: applies to holes 1 & 10 and to paths surrounding the Clubhouse. 1st hole is defined by the power poles painted white on the left-hand side of the fairway. 10th hole is defined by boundary materials to the right-hand side of the rough. Clubhouse paths shown by painted broken white line. Relief allowed under Rule 18.1 and 18.2.

EXPOSED TREE ROOTS: on closely mown areas only are considered abnormal course condition and relief is to be taken as per Rule 16.1b (Model Local Rule F-91).

POSTS AND ROPES: are IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS and relief is allowed under Rule 16.1a.

DISTANCE MARKERS: which are plants situated at 150m & 200m from the green are immovable obstructions and relief is allowed under Rule 16.1a.

METAL HOOPS & DIRECTIONAL SIGNS: can be moved but must be replaced after playing a shot.

ORNAMENTAL GARDENS: are defined by a single white post and relief is allowed under Rule 16.1a.

PATHS AND ROADS: both artificially surfaced and natural are used by motorised vehicles. Relief can be taken from these paths and roads and associated worn areas under Rule 16.1a.

SPRINKLER HEADS: are located on closely mown areas and relief is allowed under Rule 16.1b. Additional relief is allowed from sprinklers within 2 club lengths of the putting green. If a ball lies within 2 club lengths of a sprinkler, then a player may take a drop within 1 club length of the nearest point of relief.

POWER LINES OR POLES: if struck by a ball in the general area of play. The stroke is to be cancelled and must be replayed.

NEW TURF: is considered an abnormal course condition under Rule 16.1a and relief is compulsory.

PATHS CROSSING CREEKS: are part of the penalty area.

PENALTY AREAS: defined by yellow or red posts and or lines. Posts are immovable obstructions.

ABNORMAL COURSE CONDITIONS: are marked by white lines and relief is allowed under Rule 16.1a. A fallen tree limb that is too large for a player to move and physically interferes with the players area of intended stance or area of intended swing is to be treated as an abnormal course condition.

AREAS COVERED BY WOODCHIPS/MULCH: and not defined with a white stake are to be treated as an integral part of the course.

SAND BUCKETS: must be carried and used to repair divots.

COURSE ETIQUETTE

DRESS REQUIREMENTS

Please always adhere to the Dress Requirements whilst on the course and practice facilities.

SLOW PLAY AND GOLF ETIQUETTE

Members are reminded that slow play is selfish and affects all players. To know the rules and observe the Etiquette of Golf is not only a tribute to you but also to the club. Mark score cards while other members in your group are hitting off. Plan where you leave your buggy so minimising delay in reaching the next tee. Be ready to play promptly when it is your turn, including putting.

RIGHT OF WAY

If your group of players cannot keep up with the group ahead, please move aside and call the following players through.

SPIKES

Metal spikes are NOT permitted on course.

WIDE TYRE POLICY


Buggies with wide tyres are permitted to cross greens without stopping.

HOOPS

Please respect all hoops and ropes out on the course, they are there for the betterment of the course.

BUNKER ENTRY & RAKE PLACEMENT

For safety reasons it is recommended to use the lowest point of the bunker to enter and exit. Please rake bunkers after use and return the rake to the centre of the bunker in the direction of play.



PACE OF PLAY & READY GOLF

PACE OF PLAY

Please show consideration to others by playing at an appropriate pace. If delayed, allow the group behind you to play through. Your pace of play is being monitored.

READY GOLF

If you reach your ball and are ready to hit and it is safe to do so, go ahead and hit.

READY GOLF TIPS

- Adopt a ready golf attitude!
- Avoid travelling in a group from ball to ball on fairways
- Read your putt and be ready to go as soon as someone else has finished putting
- Leave your bags or golf cart to the side or rear of the green, never in front of the green
- Never stand on or next to the green after holing out in order to write down your score do it when you reach the next tee

PLEASE REMEMBER TO ALWAYS;

- Carry and use a sand bucket
- Correctly repair pitch marks
- Rake bunkers after you play

STARTER

When both the 1st and 10th tees are being used the Starter at their own discretion can and will move groups to the other tee to enable the field to get away in a timely manner. The Starer may also add players to groups when necessary.

COUNTBACK PROCEDURE

In multi-round events, the lowest score for the last 18 holes is the winner. In single round events, or ties over the last 18 holes in multi-round events, the best score for the last 9 holes wins. If still tied, then the best score for the last 6 holes is counted and if again tied then the last 3 holes are counted. If still tied, then the countback goes back hole by hole commencing with the 18th until a winner is determined.

COMPETITION STARTS

All players must report to the Starter and pick up their cards at least 15 minutes prior to scheduled hit off time.

PLEASE ENSURE YOU CHECK THE LOCAL RULES BOARD EACH TIME YOU PLAY.

COMPETITION TYPES

These notes are intended to assist in the general concept of how various competitions are played. They must read be in conjunction with the Rules of Golf and conditions laid out by the committee under which a competition is to be played (Rule 21).

It is a member's responsibility to ensure they are aware of the rules of the competition prior to commencement of play.

STROKE (MEDAL) EVENTS – Mens Saturday

The score of each hole is recorded on the score card, totalled and the player's full handicap deducted. The player that completes the stipulated round(s) in the fewest strokes is the winner. If the medal event is cancelled, it will be played the next Saturday, excluding major events.

STABLEFORD (MEDAL) EVENTS – Women's Sunday

The method of playing Stableford competition is for the player to take strokes at holes as indicated by the hole and on the card and to score points on the nett results at each hole. At the end of the round all points are added up and the player having the highest number of points is the winner. Ties decided by playoff.

PAR EVENTS

The score is recorded on the card in the same way as in stroke play.

After entering the stroke score, the par result is placed in the column provided (note that you are not required to record your stroke score if the result is worse than par after the handicap for that hole has been deducted).

The results are recorded as:				
'+' for a win (better than par)	'O' for a half (even to par)	'-' for a loss (worse than par)		

On completion of the round, the plus and minus signs are added, and the nett result is written in how many "up", "down" or "equal". A player is allowed their full handicap and the strokes are taken at holes as indicated on the card according to hole index. It is the custom that when a player is beaten by Par, the ball shall be picked up. This helps speed up play.

STABLEFORD EVENTS

The method of playing Stableford competition is for the player to take strokes at holes as indicated by the hole index on the card and to score points on the nett results at each hole. At the end of the round all points are added up and the player having the highest number of points is the winner. It is the custom when a player is unable to record nett or scratch points for a hole the ball shall be picked up. This helps speed up play.

FOURSOMES – Mens

Two players play as partners and use only one ball. The partners hit off in an alternating manner from the tee and therefore strike the ball alternating during the play at each hole. The gross scores are recorded, and the total is subject to a deduction of half the partner's aggregate handicaps.

Note if one player incurs a penalty stroke, this does not alter the rotation of play. In Foursome stroke competition held over several rounds, the order of play must be changed between rounds unless the Committee has laid down a condition of play, that the original order of play must be preserved or changed through the competition. Foursomes can be played under either stroke play rules or Matchplay conditions and Rule 22 is relevant to Foursomes.

MIXED FOURSOMES

Mixed Foursomes are played in the same manner as Foursomes except that the women use the red tees. Full handicaps apply. Teams may choose which tees to begin each round. Alternating tees from previous round is NOT mandatory.

AMBROSE

- Preferred Lies through the green (general area) 1 club length (does not include bunkers/penalty areas)
- Playing through the green (general area); clearly mark the selected ball then all players including the players ball chosen, may place their ball within 1 club length of that point not nearer the hole
- On the Putting Green; the process is the same but play from within 1 putter head length
- Playing from Bunkers/Penalty Areas; play the original selected ball first from its original position, then playing partners must drop within 1 club length of that point not nearer the hole and play the ball as it lies
- 2 Person Ambrose is a minimum of 6 tee shots each
- 3 Person Ambrose is a minimum of 3 tee shots each
- Mark players initials on the card when their tee shot is elected

NOTE: Tee Shots must be marked on the score card.

MULTIPLIER EVENTS

Four Ball Multiplier is scored each hole multiplying player A's stableford score for the hole by player B's stableford score. For example, player A scores 2 points and player B scores 3 points, then the four-ball score is 6 points. If either player fails to score, then the four-ball score is nil.

MEDLEY

Medley events are those where any combination of 2 players being male and/or female team together.

TIES: Medal Events: Members tying for the monthly Medal must playoff on next succeeding Medal round. If still tied countback applies. Players play off original handicaps. Players involved in a playoff do not have to play together.

MAJOR TROPHY EVENTS: In the event of a tie in Major Trophy Events it will be necessary for a decision to be reached within one month. Swingers are ineligible in all Major Events.

PROTESTS: A protest in connection with any competition or match shall be made to the Match Committee immediately upon completion of such competition.

RETURNING SCORE CARDS: All players must sign their card. Competition Events of Singles play with 2BBB play in conjunction requires all players to sign the card. Cards not returned to the Competition Box within fifteen (15) minutes following the completion of their round will be considered a breach of the rules and a penalty will be applied.

MATCH PLAY COMPETITIONS: Players competing in those events shall not be eligible to compete in the days ordinary competition.

BREACHES: You are required to report any breaches of the Rules of Golf which you observe, to the Match Committee.

COMPETITION STARTS: All players must report to the starter at least 15 minutes before the scheduled time. It is of assistance if members collect cards immediately upon arrival at the Club.

COMPETITION NO SHOW, LATE ARRIVAL AND CANCELLATION POLICY: It is the Members responsibility to ensure that the Golf Shop are advised of any changes or cancellation to your allocated competition tee time/s with as much notice as possible, but not less than 30 minutes prior to your allocated tee time.

Registration at the Golf Shop must be at least 15 minutes prior to your allocated tee time.

Please also be reminded that should you "book in" a group or multiple players, as the Member who "booked in" you may be deemed as responsible for the entire booking should one of the members not adhere to this policy. Failure to comply may result in the following disciplinary action by the Board of Directors.

- 1 Letter of Warning
- 2 Front the Board of Directors
- 3 Suspension

NO SHOWS: Please be reminded that it is the Players responsibility to adhere to the No Show, late arrival, and cancellation policy. Players must contact the GOLF SHOP and not rely on their playing partner or group to do so.

COMPLAINTS: All complaints shall be made in writing to the Secretary of the club, who if unable to satisfy them, shall refer the matter to the Board. No employee of the Club shall be directly reprimanded by an individual member.

COMPETITION RESULTS: Due to errors inadvertently made in competition results, a period of 2 full days may be needed to ratify winners of any day's events.

JUNIOR MEMBERS: Junior Members must have at least 1 Full Member in their group to be eligible to win a member's competition. Juniors may play together and win the 2BBB and Scratch events provided there is at least 1 Full Member in the group.

85+ YRS OF AGE OFF 36/54 HCAP: For all DGC Members 85 years of age and over with a handicap of not less than 36 men and 54 women, a local rule to be applied that the member can play off the yellow social tees in competition. Except in monthly medal, tiger tee day, major event, board event and club championships. Once the DGC Members handicap drops below 36/54, they must play off the markers of the day (i.e. Blue, White, Red markers).

PRACTICE ROUNDS: All players shall note that when practice rounds are being played on course, they must notify the starter before hitting off. No player under any circumstances is allowed to hit off the **Blue** or **Red** plates at any time other than in competition. Members are reminded to carry sand buckets during practice and fill all divots and repair their pitch marks. In a practice round members **Shall not hit more than two balls** and **must not** practice by hitting into any individual green.

Note: Any player reported for practicing off the plates will be subject to suspension from the Club by the Board.

MEMBER COMPETITION ELIGIBILITY: A member obtaining a new GA handicap or transferring a GA handicap with golflink history of less than 15 handicapped competition rounds must play and return 10 golflink approved scores at Dunheved Golf Club before being eligible to win Monthly Medal, Monthly Scratch, Board Event or Major Event.

A member transferring a GA handicap must have a golflink history of at least 15 handicapped competition rounds and must play and return 3 golflink approved scores at Dunheved Golf Club before being eligible to win the Monthly Medal, Monthly Scratch, Board Event and Major Events. Membership category restrictions may apply where stated.

A returning member with no golflink history in the past 2 years must play and return 3 golflink approved scores at Dunheved Golf Club before being eligible to win the Monthly Medal, Monthly Scratch, Board Event and Major Events. Membership category restrictions may apply where stated.

A member obtaining a new handicap must return 3 scorecards, with the last 2 scorecards being played in competition rounds. A new member / new member with different nominated home club / transfer member with a current handicap, upon payment of membership fee is entitled to play in and win standard competition events prior to membership ratification by the board of directors.

Player Eligibility: Players must be fully qualified (total golf link approved DGC rounds) prior to commencement of play in any event or qualifying round of an event to be eligible.

VISITOR COMPETITION ELIGIBILITY: Must have played at least 5 out of their 20 rounds at the home club as per golflink. Visitors from a home club within a 5km radius will have to pay a nominated fee.

PRIZES: A player may win one runner up trophy per day. A player who wins a major event cannot win a nett or runners up prize. A player who wins a nett or scratch event cannot win a runner up prize.

COMPETITION PRIZES:

GOLF BALLS - Golf Ball Vouchers can be collected from the office/bar after the competition has been finalised and must be collected within 3 months of the competition date, at which time they expire.

VOUCHERS - Competition Prize Vouchers will be transferred to members accounts automatically, a week after the competition date. Vouchers can be used at the Bar, Golf Shop and Bistro. Vouchers once placed on your account will expire once membership ceases and/or membership becomes unfinancial. Please note that any vouchers placed onto a House account must abide by the House Account rules/conditions. Members must adhere to the conditions set down for this account by Dunheved Golf Club. Jackpot on 13th hole can be placed on House Account. **VISITORS** - All competition prize vouchers and balls for Visitors without a house account can be collected at the Bar and redeemed in the Golf Shop only.

DISCLAIMER: The Match Committee reserves the right to alter or award prizes at its discretion in accordance with the running of the competition. This also applies to Visitor Competition Eligibility requirements. The program as set down is subject to change at the discretion of the Board and in some case short notice.

MEMBERS HOUSE ACCOUNT TERMS & CONDITIONS

- Members House Account can be used over the bar for bar products both alcohol and non-alcohol, at the Bistro and in the Golf Shop for purchases *excluding* motorised cart hire, equipment hire, golf lessons and green fees.
- Is to be used for products consumed on the premises, i.e., for single items sold at single item price. As we understand members sometimes wish to take drinks on the golf course, should a member wish to purchase a six pack of beer for this purpose, the Club will permit the six pack to be purchased using the House Account at the six-pack price, but no other 'bulk' purchases.
- Must have current Membership "FOB" present to utilise the House Account.
- Credit can be added to your House Account in the form of Cash, Dunheved Dollars, or Dunheved Competition Prize Vouchers but under no circumstances can be withdrawn or transferred.
- Competition Prize Vouchers will be transferred to members accounts automatically, one week after the competition date.
- A member who has not renewed their membership in full, cannot access their House Account after 30th June each year. If a member does not renew their membership by 31st July each year, then the members House Account will be closed, and any unused amount forfeited.
- The total amount that can be rolled over from a Members House Account each year must not exceed \$500 and is subject to the conditions of the abovementioned being satisfied. Any unused amount over and above \$500 as at 30th June will be forfeited.
- The Rules and Conditions of the Members House Account can be varied without notice at the discretion of the Board. These terms and conditions supersede all prior.
- These details have been approved by the Office of Liquor and Gaming, and provision is made under the Club's Article of Association.

Please Note: Members are reminded that the Responsible Service of Alcohol is adhered to at Dunheved Golf Club. The Terms and Conditions of the House Account Policy can change from time to time as determined by the Board of Directors and members will be notified accordingly.

ADDITIONAL NOTES;

- Professional Golfers cannot win scratch
- All Individual Scratch scores less than 32 points = 2 balls allocated
- All 2BBB Scratch scores less than Even/36/64 points = 2 balls each
- Scratch prize is first awarded competition prize (** with exception)
- If a competition is abandoned due to lack of players only, the competition fee will be refunded by the Club.
- If 7 or more Visitors play in a closed members competition a prize will be allocated.



MAJOR EVENT CONDITIONS OF PLAY

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS – MENS
